- Complete an NJSBA Policy Wellness Check to ensure that the board's policy manual is current
- Complete an analysis of the district's negotiated teachers contract by NJSBA's Legal and Labor Relations staff
- Demonstrate commitment to continuous improvement through completion of the annual board self-evaluation
- Comply with current mandatory training requirements for each board member
- Satisfy the governance portion of the NJDOE monitoring process (If the board has not received a satisfactory rating from the NJDOE and the state has intervened in board operations, the board may demonstrate effective governance by pursuing the alternate route of annually adopting and implementing a "Code of Governance" developed with NJSBA staff.)
